Spark and Vodafone - Far North Proposed District Plan - Subdivision connection rule

Requirement for subdivisions to have electricity and telecommunication connections is supported in SUB-P6 and SUB-P11

S517.001 & S517.002

SUB-P6

Require infrastructure to be provided in an integrated and comprehensive manner by:

a. demonstrating that the subdivision will be appropriately serviced and integrated with existing and planned infrastructure if available; and b. ensuring that the infrastructure is provided is in accordance the purpose, characteristics and qualities of the zone.

SUB-P11

- Manage subdivision to address the effects of the activity requiring resource consent including (but not limited to) consideration of the following matters where relevant to the application:

 a. consistency with the scale, density, design and character of the environment and purpose of the zone;

 b. the location, scale and design of buildings and structures;

 c. the adequacy and capacity of available or programmed development infrastructure to accommodate the proposed activity; or the capacity of the site to cater for on-site infrastructure associated with the proposed activity;
- the proposed activity,
 d. managing natural hazards;
 e. Any adverse effects on areas with historic heritage and cultural values, natural features and landscapes, natural character or indigenous biodiversity values; and
 f. any historical, spiritual, or cultural association held by tangata whenua, with regard to the matters set out in Policy TW-P6.

SUB-R1 Boundary Adjustments, SUB-R3 Subdivision of land to create a new allotment, SUB-R5 Subdivision around an approved multi-unit development, and SUB-R6 Environmental benefit subdivision all require telecommunication connection via compliance with SUB-S6. Non-compliance becomes a restricted discretionary.

SUB-R6 requires connection not clear if there is a requirement to provide telecommunication connections beyond the urban and Rural residential and Horticulture Processing Facility zones as Rural and Rural Production zones are not mentioned in SUB-R6.

In addition, Rural residential and Horticulture Processing Facility zones are zones that would be normally under RBI be serviced via wireless connectivity. Spark and Vodafone are submitting to amend SUB-S6 to recognise wireless connectivity in rural areas. We have marked up an alternative SUB-S6 below.

Spark and Vodafone consider that the following amendments in red underline enable and support all Far North residents/business and customers both urban and rural to achieve access to telecommunications. In urban areas the emphasis is fibre connectivity and where this is not available wireless connectivity. If \$517,003 neither is available, then VDSL copper is the minimum standard. If nothing is available, the applicant will have to go for a restricted discretionary application.
