See McNutt V. GMAC 298 US 178 and Maxfields Lesse V. Levey, 4 US 308

"Once jurisdiction is challenged the court can not proceed where it clearly lacks jurisdiction". The court has no authority to reach merits but rather should dismiss the action, Melo V US 505 F2d 1026

There is no discretion to ignore the lack of jurisdiction Joyce V. US 474 F2d 215.

Jurisdiction can be challenged at anytime even on final determination Bassett V. Utah Power and Light Co 495 2nd 906 at 910
