Z Energy, however, considers that it is appropriate for service stations to be a permitted activity in the Mixed Use Zone ( <i>MUZ</i> ), regardless of gross floor area, for the following reasons:			
						<ul> <li>Service stations provide an essential service (vehicle fuel / energy) which supports the wellbeing of communities, and are designed in a manner which broadly supports the function and maintains the amenity of a typical mixed use environment.</li> </ul>			
						<ul> <li>Service stations are designed to integrate into the zone and environment in which they will be located in terms of design, transportation and safety in accordance with the requirements of District Plans, Regional Plans and National Environmental Standards, as well as other regulations or statutes.</li> </ul>			
						<ul> <li>Service stations are not listed among the activities which MUZ-P5 seeks to restrict nor are they considered to inherently adversely affect the function, role, sense of place or amenity of the MUZ.</li> </ul>			
						<ul> <li>Overall, service stations can achieve the outcomes, objectives and policies of the MUZ and should remain as a permitted activity.</li> </ul>			
						Service stations provide an essential service to communities, and it is important that they are enabled in central areas. It is noted that the only other zone which service stations are specifically provided for as a permitted activity is the Heavy Industry Zone ( <i>HIZ</i> ). HIZ land is limited and is some distance away from many MUZ areas across the District. For example, the closest HIZ land to Kaikohe or Paihia is in Moerewa which is approximately 25 km to 30 km away from either town.
