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Appendix 1 – Officers Recommended Amendments to Public Access Chapter

Note the below provisions represent the Section 42A Report Writing Officer's recommended amendments to the provisions of the Proposed District Plan, in response to submissions (with <u>underline</u> used for new text and strikethrough for deleted text). Recommendations made through the Reporting Officer's right of reply are shown in red underline for new text and red strikethrough for deleted text.

Overview

The Far North District has an extensive coastline and many rivers and lakes with high recreational, cultural and amenity values. The communities in the district value access to these resources.

The coastal and riparian margins provide public and customary access, together with landscape or visual amenity, recreation, hazard management and ecological values.

The maintenance and enhancement of public access to and along the coastal marine area, lakes and rivers is recognised as a matter of national importance in the RMA. This public access may include the ability to walk, cycle or drive to or along these esplanade reserves. It may also include supporting facilities such as restrooms and parking facilities.

At the time of subdivision, Council will consider the opportunity to take land adjacent to the coastal marine area or waterbodies for an esplanade reserve. The requirements for esplanade reserves will be implemented in accordance with section 77 and Part 10 of the RMA. In some circumstances, Council may determine that an esplanade strip is more appropriate¹. Council will consider the effects of climate change, including sea-level rise and risks of natural hazards when making decisions². In cases where an esplanade is not required by the District Plan provisions, esplanades may be created by other methods. For example, a landowner may agree to provide an esplanade reserve or strip voluntarily (section 235 of the RMA) or a third party (such as a community group) may assist with funding a reserve³.

Council has a responsibility under the RMA, the NZCPS and the RPS to manage public access to and along the coastal marine area and waterbodies.

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b. protects, maintains or enhances the landscape values; protects, maintains or enhances public access; d. enables public recreation; e. provides connectivity between esplanade reserves, esplanade strips, access strips and other public f. provides for access to or the protection of the cultural or historic heritage values or sites and areas of significance to Māori including for the purposes of mahinga kai and fisheries⁸; or g. does not increase the risk of natural hazards and assists in the mitigation of existing risks associated with natural hazards. Any application to waive the requirement for, or reduce the width of, an esplanade specified in SUB-S8 will be considered against the purposes of esplanade reserves and esplanade strips in Section 229 of the Resource Management 1991 and Policy PA-P3 15.

All zones	 Any subdivision involving the creation of one or more allotments less than 4ha which adjoins: The line of MHWS; The bank of a river whose bed has an average width of 3m or more; or A lake that is larger than 8 ha in size.
